General Information

EC Rules will be in effect from Thursday 7am through to completion of classes on Sunday.

Helmets are required while riding on show grounds

Entries for horse show are to be submitted via www.showgroundslive.com

Fees are subject to GST

Add/Drop/Change

Class adds, drops (scratches) and class changes are required to be submitted on-line through your ShowGroundsLive account. In order to be refunded the class fee, scratches are due prior to the start of the applicable class and can be done through your SGL account. Please note EC memberships are required and classes will be unable to be added if rider/trainer/owner memberships are not current. EC Horse Temp fee will be added to all entries where horse is not showing as current with Equestrian Canada. All adds are to be submitted online by 5pm the day prior. Please note, a \$20 charge per class will be added for day of adds. We encourage riders/trainers to add the day prior at no charge to allow for more accurate scheduling. Classes ridden with no written add prior to the start of the class will be charged an additional \$20 Rode Not Entered

Fee. Day of adds will be based on schedule availability and management approval. There is no guarantee that day of adds will be accepted. As per GR A801.9 Competitors are responsible for their own errors and those of their agents in the completion of their entry forms.

Age – Junior Riders

EC juniors are riders who have not reached their 18th birthday as of January 1st of the current year. Juniors ages are required to be stated on the entry form, and birth certificates are to be available on request. Riders from the United States qualify as juniors with the United States Equestrian Federation through December 1st of the year they turn 18 years of age. Equestrian Canada Rules state: The age of a rider on Jan 1 will be maintained throughout the competition year which runs from Jan 1 to Dec 31; Junior A: a rider who is 15, 16 or 17 on Jan 1; Junior B: a rider who is 12, 13 or 14 on Jan 1; Junior C: a rider who is 12 on Jan 1.

Amateur Eligibility

(Artical 108) Any person who has ridden on a Senior National Eventing or Jumping Team is not eligible to compete in the amateur division for a period of two years from the date of the last competition at which the athlete rode for the team. Athletes who are on the Jumping Short List for the Canadian Team for the current year are excluded from amateur classes for that year.

Attire | Formal

Dark, muted or similar colored, or red (scarlet) coats; white or fawn breeches, a white tie, choker (unless the shirt, by design, has the choker built in for its intended use) or hunting stock, and a white or lightly colored shirt. Shirts are required to have a white collar and white cuffs, fastened at the neck and tucked in. Traditional black or brown boots are required. Half chaps are permitted as long as the color matches the paddock boots being worn. Members of the Armed Services or the police may wear the service dress uniform with protective headgear. Classes requiring formal attire are any Grand Prix or special class offering \$10,000 or more and all Classics. Riders will be notified by management where exceptions to formal attire are required due to Thunderbird Sponsor relations. At Thunderbird Show Park, we ask that you please be sure you are dressed according to the protocol for the class you are entering in.

Attire | Proper Jumper

Coats of any color are required with breeches of a light color (white or fawn). Pastel and dark colored breeches are not allowed. Shirts, light in color, are to be tucked in and fastened at the top of the neck. Ties or chokers of any color are to be worn (unless the shirt, by design, has the choker built in for its intended use). Traditional black or brown boots are required. Half chaps are permitted as long as the color matches the paddock boots being worn. Classes requiring proper attire are any classes in the Fort Grand Prix Ring where formal is not required and any Classic.

Campers, RV's and Motor Homes

Limited number of RV sites will be available for rental. Please submit Reservation Form to cojocar1@telus.net
People staying onsite in an RV will be asked to check in with the Parking Guard on the road beside the West Barn for a temperature check each morning.

Competition Office

The Rendezvous Office will be a virtual office! For trainer questions there will be a 'Walk Up' window available from inside the Main Indoor Arena. The 'Walk Up' window will be where a designated person will collect their 'Trainer Check In packets' which will include all back numbers, parking passes etc. for the Trainer group. Concussion

Accidents & Return to Play rule: In the event of a fall/accident where a concussion can be reasonably suspected, the competitors must receive medical clearance by qualified medical personnel onsite before continuing to compete. The competitor is solely responsible for ensuring the onsite medical assessment takes place. Should a competitor refuse to be evaluated, they will be disqualified from the competition. If onsite qualified medical personnel suspect a concussion or believe the competitor may be at risk of concussion due to the nature of the fall or impact, the competitor will be suspended from competition and placed on a Medical Suspension List until medically released. Competitors will remain on the EC Medical Suspension List until they submit an EC Return to Play Form, signed by a licensed physician, to EC. No competitor shall compete at EC sanctioned competitions while on the EC Medical Suspension List and competition organizers may refuse entry to anyone currently on the list.

Contact Tracing

Community Contact Tracing will be in effect. Trainers will be emailed a Contact Form to be returned to shauna@tbird.ca in excel format prior to your arrival. Two people per horse will be granted access to the Show Park. Upon entrance these people will be given a wrist band to wear for the remainder of the week. Each week will require a separate Contact Tracing Form. Each individual will have temperature checked daily prior to gaining access to the Show Park.

Cross Entry Rules

Article G604.3; Junior and Amateur horse/rider combinations are permitted unlimited upward movement, but downward movement is restricted to one level only. These movements are based on the level of the first EC rated junior or amateur class in which they competed. Professionals are permitted unlimited upward and downward movement.

Deposit & Payment

A \$250 deposit will be applied to all horse entries. Deposits are refundable up until September 28th. Please email shauna@tbird.ca for any scratches.

Drug Testing

All competitors will be assessed an EC drug fee of \$7 per horse. All competitors/horses are subject to drug testing and agree that they will allow themselves and their horses to be drug tested.

Eliminations

The EC "2 Refusal Elimination Rule" in all jumper classes is followed at Thunderbird Show Park. Jumpers will be scored under FEI Table A Article 238.2.2 unless otherwise specified. The competitor has the right to jump a single obstacle after retiring or after being eliminated provided that the obstacle is part of the course of the current competition (this does not apply to elimination resulting from a fall). Falls will result in elimination, rider will not be permitted to remount.

Equestrian Canada Statement of Principle

Equestrian Canada, the national equestrian federation of Canada, supports adherence to humane treatment of horses in all activities under its jurisdiction. EC is committed to: Upholding the welfare of the horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities; Requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect and the compassion that they deserve, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment; Ensuring that owners, trainers and exhibitors or their agents use responsible care in the handling, treatment and transportation of their horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose; Providing for the continuous well-being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure; Continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare; Requiring owners, trainers and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules, and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competition; Reviewing, revising and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horses. The standard by which conduct or treatment will be measured is that which a person, informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and exhibition procedures, would determine to be neither cruel, abusive, nor inhumane.

Equestrian Canada Entry Agreement

By signing the entry form you agree to the following statement: I hereby certify that every horse, rider and/or driver is eligible as entered and agree for myself and my representatives to be bound by the Constitution and rules of Equine Canada at this competition. It is hereby recognized that all equestrian sports involve inherent risk and that no helmet or protective equipment can protect against all foreseeable injury. I hereby accept this risk and hold harmless EC, the competition, their officials, organizers, agents, employees and their representatives. The person responsible (PR) agrees to the release of any information on the entry form to EC." (A802.4). In the event that an exhibitor participates in an Equine Canada sanctioned competition where approved headgear is required for juniors, he/she will wear a properly fitted, ASTM or BSI/BS EN approved helmet. It is understood that competitors not meeting this requirement will not be allowed to compete at these competitions. Per Article A801, every entry at an EC-sanctioned competition shall

constitute an agreement by the person(s) responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition. It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in EC-sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules, if any, imposed by the competition. Do not participate in this EC-sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed by the competition.

Falls

In case of a fall of an Athlete and/or Horse at any time in the Competition arena, in the practice arena or elsewhere within the grounds of the Event, the Athlete and/or the Horse must be cleared by the Event's medical service, respectively the Veterinary Delegate, before the Athlete and/or the Horse may be permitted to take part in the next round of Competition at the event.

Farrier & Other Fees

All outside, non-office fees including but not limited to farrier, veterinary and other vendor fees cannot be applied to an exhibitor's accounts or paid through the Competition Office.

Feed & Bedding

All stalls will include first bedding consisting of 5 bags of premium shavings. Bedding is placed in all stalls including tack stalls. All feed and bedding orders are required to be submitted via ShowGroundsLive through your account. Phone orders cannot be accepted. Please submit all trainer split information via email to shauna@tbird.ca by Friday 5pm.

Golf Carts & Motorized Vehicles

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state/province in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. Golf carts will be limited to one person per cart at all times, or a caretaker of under aged children. Drivers are required to hold a valid driver's license. Thunderbird Arena Order of Go

A computer drawn order will be posted for classes in the Thunderbird Arena. Orders will be posted each night online at showgroundslive.com.

Handsfree Devices

Earphones and/or other electronic communication devices are strictly prohibited in all EC/FEI Competitions, and such usage is penalized by elimination. The use of one earbud/earphone is allowed while mounted except in the competition rings.

Hard Hat Rule

Equestrian Canada, USEF and FEI competitions require anyone mounted on a horse on the competition grounds, to wear approved helmets (see Glossary in General Regulations, Book A), with safety harness correctly fastened, at all times. Juniors showing any horse in a jog for

soundness must wear approved protective headwear with the attached safety harness fastened. Riders violating this rule are prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place.

Haul-Ins

The haul-in fee \$125 per week for all non stabled horses. The above fees will also apply to any horses sharing a stall. Please enter at main participant entrance on 72nd Ave and then continue to the upper parking lot above the Pacific Park Arena.

Hors Concours (non judged rides)

Hors Concours rounds will be permitted at management's discretion. Hors concours rounds are not permitted to take a jump off round. Hors Concours carry the same fee as the class in which the Hors Concours took place, and horses/ponies may only do one round per ring, per day. Once a Hors Concours round has taken place, the horse/pony may not compete in that ring until the following day.

Horse Recording

Horse Recordings are mandatory for all horses and ponies entering EC sanctioned competitions. Any horse not current with EC and competing in the Grand Prix Ring will have an EC Horse Temp added to their account. Horses must be entered under the name and with the same owner as appearing on the Horse Recording. (A402) EC sanctioned competitions require the following (where applicable): An active Horse Recording, EC National Passport (with active Horse Recording component) or FEI Passport (with active Horse Recording component). Foreign owned horses may compete with national passports recognized by the FEI. USEF horses may compete with a valid USEF Horse Recording Number. Persons responsible for US or other foreign-owned/leased horses competing in EC-Sanctioned Competitions must complete an affidavit stating that their horse(s) are eligible to compete as entered and must declare the jumper registration number(s) that have been assigned by their respective national federation. If a Horse Recording, an EC National Passport or FEI Passport cannot be produced, the person responsible must complete a Temporary Horse Registration form and pay the temporary registration fee. Results achieved while competing with a Temporary Horse Registration may not be used to qualify for year-end awards, championship competitions, finals or subsequent competitions requiring qualification. In the case of ponies eight years or over, the owner must enter a statement as to whether the pony is small, medium or large and this must also be signed and dated. Regarding pony measurement, refer to Chapter A11, Measurement, and discipline/breed sport rules. For ponies under eight, see Article A1104, Temporary Measurement Forms. Where applicable, the pony measurement section must be completed. Temporary pony measurement forms must be in the possession of the owner and or the lessee and available to competition management or stewards.

Jump Canada Levy

Gold and Platinum Equine Canada Hunter Jumper competitions will collect a \$20 fee per horse.

Juniors & Stallions

(Article G105) Junior "B" and "C" riders may not ride or handle stallions anywhere on the competition grounds. Junior "A" riders may ride manageable stallions in jumper classes only. All stallions ridden by a junior are required to be accompanied by a competent adult/Person Responsible. Manageable stallions ridden by seniors are eligible for all senior classes. Decisions as to the manageability of stallions are at the discretion of the judge or steward. Unmanageable stallions will be excused from the ring and/or warm-up areas.

Lunging

Designated areas are available for lunging. Lunging in schooling rings is permitted up to one hour prior to the start of competition. Lunging is not permitted in any of the show rings or on the berms or in other areas around the competition grounds.

Management

Management reserves the right to interpret all questions and conditions regarding or arising out of the show without claims, damages or recourse of any kind. For all questions not covered in these rules, horse show management shall decide regulations, and management's decision is final. The horse show management reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally or to cancel any entries, disqualify riders or exhibitors, prohibit claim damages, change any course, cancel or combine any unfilled classes, reschedule classes (after due notice to exhibitors), change rings or rotate judges, and to change specifications in jumper classes at any time. Thunderbird reserves the right to use all photos and videos taken at all Show Park events.

Masks

Everyone must wear a mask at all times unless mounted, as well as being optional in your barn aisle and at your RV Site. Please bring your own mask(s) with you.

Measurement

EC sanctioned events/competitions will only accept valid EC measurement cards. To compete in classes restricted to ponies, a foreign pony must have an EC measurement card. Exception: EC recognizes valid USEF measurement cards for all divisions. In the event that a pony possesses both EC and USEF measurement cards, the card used to determine the pony's eligibility in a class will be that card associated to the horse recording of the home National Federation. i.e. American ponies must use USEF measurement cards and Canadian ponies must use EC measurement cards.

Memberships

Competitors, owners and riders are required to have an individual gold sport license or higher with Equestrian Canada & Horse Council of British Columbia or be a bona fide member of their own National Equestrian Federation.

Nomination Fee

Thunderbird Arena carries a nomination fee of \$100. In the case of an entry competing in multiple rings only the higher nomination fee will apply. Ring nomination fees at Thunderbird Show Park include all of your add, scratch, class nomination, division nomination fees. We run a "No Play, No Pay" policy; as long as your horse has scratched prior to the start of the class, full fees are refunded without any penalty. Please scratch online through your ShowGroundsLive account.

Numbers

All horses (stabled, non-stabled, showing and non-showing) will be assigned a number and are required to wear the number at all times when out of the stable. Numbers will not be released without a Person Responsible and Trainer's signature and credit card number or signed barn cheque on file in the competition office. There is a \$500 fine for the misrepresentation of any horse; including but not limited to showing multiple horses under the same number, and bringing a horse onsite that is not properly entered.

Parking

Proper decals are required to park in handicapped and reserved parking spots. Improperly parked vehicles will be towed and charged a \$100 donation to Langley Animal Protection Society. Due to a limited number of parking spots, complimentary parking passes are given to trainers and sponsors.

Paddocks

A limited number of grass paddocks are available for \$300 + tax per week. Paddocks are of metal construction and are separated by walkways. Each paddock has its own gate and exhibitors are encouraged to bring locks for security when not in use. In the event of selling out, barns will be limited to one paddock.

Payment

Full payment of show bill is due upon completion of horse show. Accounts still unpaid after 7 days will be charged 1.75% interest per month. NSF cheques/declined credit cards are subject to a \$50.00 fee. The credit card indicated on the entry form will be responsible for the deposit and all other fees related to the entry. Changes to the card responsible for an entry may be made for future charges, but refunds for past charges due to a change of card will incur a \$10 fee. Only show scratches and substitutions will have deposits refunded without a fee. We accept debit and alternatively credit card with a 2.5% Convenience Fee.

Pets

thbird is dog friendly! All pets are required to be kept on a leash while on Thunderbird Property. Owners whose pets are found off leash will be subject to a fine which will be donated to Langley Animal Protection Society. We also ask that you kindly clean up after your pet. Disposal bags are conveniently located around Thunderbird Show Park.

Post Entries

Accepted based on availability. Entries submitted after the closing date will be subject to a \$50 late fee. Entries submitted on or after Monday of the show week are subject to a \$100 fee.

Prize Money

All prize money will be paid in Canadian funds. Unless otherwise requested, prize monies will be applied against outstanding show balances with residual issued to the horse owner within 30 days of the completion of each competition.

Rubber Mats

A limited amount of 4x6 mats are available for rental on a first come first serve basis.

Scheduling

Show management reserves the right to make class and schedule changes at any time.

Schooling

All Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitors are required to use current FEI schooling rules as listed. Refer to Chapter 8, FEI rules, Article 201, and Annex 1 - Exercise and Schooling

Areas and Practice Obstacles: These rules pertain to all hunter, equitation, and jumper classes and divisions at all EC sanctioned competitions. a) Use of coloured sheets over the take-off side or under a properly constructed obstacle is permitted. b) Flags on fences in the schooling areas are at the discretion of the EC steward on duty. c) In Equitation and Hunter competitions and schooling rings, plastic cups or FEI breakaway track systems with adaptors are required. Steel pins are not acceptable. See Article G116. d) Hunter Schooling only: Ground Lines- A ground line may be used on both sides of an oxer if the top rails are not ramped. If the oxer is ramped, the back ground line must be removed. Top rails may not be offset. General Oxer Rules: Square- both back and front rails of an oxer are equal height, back and front ground lines allowed. Offset- the back rail of an oxer is lower than the front rail, illegal. Ramped- the back rail of an oxer is higher than the front rail, legal if back ground line is removed. e) If a Liverpool is being used lengthwise for schooling, the total length of the Liverpool may not exceed 1.80 meters. If a Liverpool is used in the competition ring, an additional one (or reasonable substitution) supplied by the OC must be available in the schooling area. A reasonable substitution would be a yoga mat or similar. No tarpaulins are permitted.

Sharps

Sharps containers are located on the grounds. Please note that improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments may be subject to a fine of \$100.

Show Scratch

The competition office must be notified of all scratches in writing by mail, fax or e-mail. Phone messages will not be accepted. For show scratches made before the show closing date, a full refund will apply. After horse has been checked in there will be no refunds of stalls, nomination fees, exhibitor fees, feed, bedding, RV res, paddocks, or any completed classes.

Stabling/Tack Stalls

Stall doors are provided by Thunderbird Show Park. Indoor Stabling \$325, Outdoor Stabling \$225, Outdoor Premium Stabling \$275. Five bags pre bedding will be applied to all Rendezvous Wk #3 stalls.

Smoking

Smoking or vaping is not allowed within 6 meters of any barn or building.

Ties

In the case of a tie, any prize money will be added together and divided equally.

Thunderbird BioSecurity

BioSecurity is everyone's responsibility! Thunderbird Show Park is committed to providing a safe and healthy environment for all exhibitors and their horses. All show participants are requested to practice good disease prevention practices. Travelling and showing horses are at an

increased risk for contracting and spreading contagious diseases. Paton and Martin Veterinary Services, 604 856 3351 are the official Thunderbird Show Park veterinarians. All horses entering the show grounds must not have been in contact with any sick horses within the last 15 days. They must not exhibit any sign of illness. Any horse that has been sick or exposed to an infectious disease within the last 15 days must have their attending veterinarian contact the Thunderbird Show Park veterinarian prior to entry to the show grounds. All horses are required to be verifiably current on Influenza and EHV 1-4 vaccines (within 6 months). All horses while on the show grounds are expected to have their temperatures taken and recorded on a daily basis during the show. Please have temperature records available upon request. We require that any horse with a rectal temperature above 38.5 C (101.8 F) report to the show management and/or the show veterinarian immediately. The show veterinarian will examine any horses with an elevated temperature or other signs of illness prior to being allowed to show. Failure to comply may result in your horses being required to enter our quarantine isolation barn or leave the show grounds. Any horse identified to have or is suspected of having a contagious disease will be removed to the isolation area. It is advised that all exhibitors have a contingency plan in the event that a sick horse in their care needs to be removed from the show grounds. We require that braiders/grooms/riders use the hand sanitizers, provided in the stall areas after handling any horse. Please avoid any direct or indirect contact between horses, in particular nose to nose contact and use of any common feed/drinking buckets. The early detection of any contagious disease is the key to prevention of a disease outbreak. Following these simple requirements will be a major step in the prevention of the spread of disease. We appreciate your cooperation and look forward to everyone having a successful horse show experience.

Equine Vaccination Rule

All horses entering the grounds of a Federation licensed competition are required to be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables. Records will be required prior to receiving your competition number. It is the intent of Thunderbird Show Park to offer a safe and healthy competition environment for all exhibitors and their horses. (A602.8)

Warm Up Arena Protocol

Warm up arenas will be limited to 2 people on foot per warm up jump, stationed at opposite sides of the jump, in that particular arena. Stewards will be managing those numbers, as well as sanitizing hands as people enter and exit the arena.
